Proverbs 19

- (p) Foolishness (19:1-3)
 - 1 Better is a poor person who walks in his integrity Than a person who is perverse in speech and is a fool.
 - 1 Better is a poor man who walks in his integrity Than he who is perverse in speech and is a fool.
 - 1 A poor man who walks blamelessly is better than a fool who speaks perversely.
 - 1 Better is the poor that walks in his integrity, than he that is perverse in his lips, and is a fool.
- 2 Also it is not good for a person to be without knowledge, And one who hurries his footsteps errs.
- 2 Also it is not good for a person to be without knowledge, And he who hurries his footsteps errs.
- 2 Furthermore, it isn't good to be ignorant, and whoever rushes into things misses the mark.

2 Also, that the soul be without knowledge, it is not good; and he that hastens with his feet sins.

(q) Illegitimate friendships (19:4-7)

4 Wealth adds many friends, But a poor person is separated from his friend.

4 Wealth brings many friends, but a poor man is deserted by his friend.

4 Wealth makes many friends; but the poor is separated from his neighbor.

5 A false witness will not go unpunished, And one *who* declares lies will not escape.

5 A witness to lies will not go unpunished; the teller of falsehoods will not escape.

5 A false witness shall not be unpunished, and he that speaks lies shall not escape.

6 Many will seek the favor of a generous person, And every person is a friend to him who gives gifts.

6 Many curry favor of an official; everyone is a friend of the gift giver.

(s) Family relationships (19:13-14)

13 A foolish son is destruction to his father, And the quarrels of a wife are a constant dripping.

(t) Laziness and carelessness 19:15-16)

15 Laziness casts *one* into a deep sleep, And a lazy person will suffer hunger.

15 Slothfulness casts into a deep sleep; and an idle soul shall suffer hunger.

16 One who keeps the commandment keeps his soul, *But* one who is careless of conduct will die.

16 Whoever obeys a commandment keeps himself safe, but someone who is contemptuous in conduct will die.

(u) Kindness (19:17)

17 One who is gracious to a poor person lends to the LORD, And He will repay him for his good deed.

(v) Childrearing (19:18)

(w) Anger (19:19)

(x) Advice and plans (19:20-21)

20 Hear counsel, and receive instruction, that thou may be wise in thy latter end.

(y) Life (19:22-23)

22 What is desirable in a person is his kindness, And *it is* better to be a poor person than a liar.

(z) Folly (19:24-29)

24 The lazy one buries his hand in the dish, *But* will not even bring it back to his mouth.

24 The sluggard buries his hand in the dish, *But* will not even bring it back to his mouth.

25 Strike a scoffer and the naive may become clever, But rebuke one who has understanding, *and* he will gain knowledge.

25 If you scourge a scoffer, the simple person may learn to be discreet; rebuke a discerning man and he will gain understanding.

28 A corrupt witness mocks justice, and the wicked person feeds on iniquity.

28 An ungodly witness scorns judgment: and the mouth of the wicked devours iniquity.
